On December 8<sup>th</sup> the BOD met with Optimum managers concerning the completion of the fiber network and the individual connections to each home. Contractors, hired by Optimum, will extend the fiber backbone, already in the ground, to each home on both sides of the street.

The contractors will leave a fifty-foot coil of fiber cable by the side of each house. Optimum will then make appointments, section by section, to have their technicians complete the installations inside each house. Realistically, this will take several months to complete. Weather conditions and home-owner availability will affect this time line. In the meantime, the triple play service should continue uninterrupted.

## BOOK NOTES

### WIN EVERY ARGUMENT, by Mehdi Hasan

Do you ever have to talk to a group? Do you like it when you get your way?

Mehdi Hasan debates for a living. His three-year-old MSNBC/Peacock *The Mehdi Hasan Hour* ended in December 2023, but he continues as an MSNBC political analyst and guest host. In *Win Every Argument: The Art of Debating, Persuading and Public Speaking* (2023, Henry Holt), he shares his techniques for getting the point across and eliciting the answers you're looking for:

Win over your audience by knowing who they are, grabbing their attention and connecting with them.

How many are there? Who are they? What is their rough demographic?

Say something interesting in your first sentence. Ask them a question. Tell them a personal anecdote that will help them relax, warm to you and listen to you.

Make eye contact. Give sincere compliments. Share an autobiographical detail or an emotion you are feeling in the moment.

Be persuasive by using logos (logic), pathos (emotion) and ethos (ethics, character; = believability).

Tell a story. Choose your words carefully. Show, don't just tell.

Have receipts, proof, with you that you can produce at the right moment. This enables you to challenge your opponent's character, your opponent's credentials and your opponent's claims.

Truly listen to and hear your opponent. Clear your mind, keep it open, take notes.

Stay present. Make eye contact. Ask the right questions.

Make them laugh, because punch lines build rapport, levity lightens the mood and nothing will work better for you than getting an honest laugh at your opponent's expense.

Be self-deprecating, spontaneous and expressive.

Don't be offensive, or go too far or appear wooden.

Be prepared to throw your opponent off when the moment is right, with some tricks Hasan refers to as judo moves. Take the wind out of your opponent's sails by conceding a point or stating your opponent's argument first yourself or reframing the facts just used against you to suit your side of the argument.

Use zingers to catch your opponent off-guard and bring home your point. Be prepared, keep your barbs short and pick your moment.

Follow the rule of three. Hasan cites research demonstrating our ability to reliably recall three items but not reliably more. Our brains are wired to like patterns, he says, and "Three happens to be the smallest number that allows us to see a pattern."

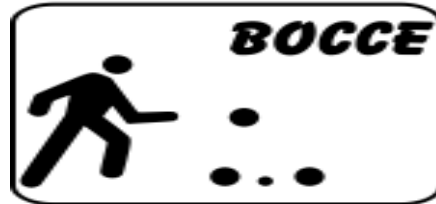

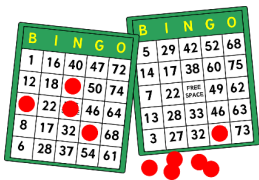

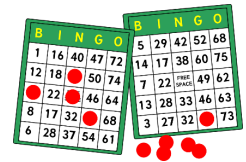

## LEISURE GLEN COMMUNITY MINUTES

### November 2023 Board Meeting Highlights

#### **November 3, 2023**

- Replaced Temperature Control Thermostat in Clubhouse refrigerator.
- Leaf clean-up continues throughout the community.
- Concerns were raised about the extensive use of strong blowers and leaf removal and the effect on the environment and wildlife. Possibly consider a manual method such as a lawn sweeper and rakes. Board consensus is that would be impractical since there are too many trees and leaves to remove.
- Halloween decorations were successfully displayed with hooks on the moldings in the Clubhouse.
- Concerns voiced about the condition of the Clubhouse and how everyone is responsible for the care and maintenance of the room.
- Holiday music will be broadcast throughout the Clubhouse during the season.
- Samples of the Liability Insurance were distributed to the appropriate Club Presidents.
- Ed Marczak, President of the Board, attended the Recreation Council meeting on 11/2/23 and thanked all of the Club Presidents for their efforts on behalf of the community.
- The next Recreation Council meeting will be on January 11, 2024. There will not be a meeting in December.
- The Welcome Committee, The Men’s Club & Women’s Guild continue to look for cabinet storage space in the Clubhouse. Several sheds, some closets and the basement should be cleared out for new items.
- Welcome Committee gift bags are prepared. Assignments for visitations are being scheduled. The next meeting will be on 11/9/23.
- Year-end reports are being finalized for the Budget & Finance meeting next week.
- There was picketing at the Suffolk County Town Hall a few days ago in regard to the relocation of the Lithium Battery Storage Facility, however, the picketers were advised that this is a State issue and the picketing was not effective. We are still awaiting a letter from the Congressman to submit on behalf of The Glen residents to Governor Hochul about deterring the Battery Storage Facility.
- After reviewing and discussing the asking of 3 predetermined questions to the Board of Director candidates during the “Meet Your Candidates” Meeting, it was agreed that asking spontaneous questions from the floor (1 per resident), should be asked to the candidates instead, to not limit the subject matter of the questions to only certain topics. The Board voted in favor of a change in the “Meet Your Candidates” Meeting procedure, in which candidates would answer spontaneous questions (1 per resident) from the floor, instead of questions pre-approved by the Board.

### **November 17, 2023**

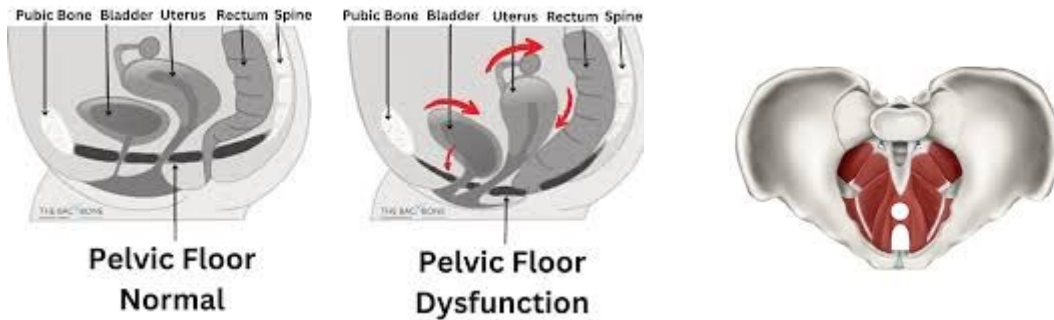
- Repaired the Chain link Fence at 201 Glen Drive due to tree damage.
- Replaced the Split Rail fence on Plainview Court facing the Paseo with white PVC.
- The Gatehouse Exit Gate has been repaired and is working properly.
- All Gatehouse Entrance Gate lights are being synchronized.
- Elections were held for The Glen Cafe Club (President: Debbie Mercurio; Vice President: Rosalie Russo) and The Social Club (President: Eileen Becak; Vice President: Linda O'Connor).
- There was a request from Debbie for a Dart Board which was approved for outdoor use. A special backboard will be provided, and can be placed on the Pergola Column in the Shuffleboard Courts. The Dart Board can be stored in the shed with the outdoor Corn Hole games and can be played whenever weather permits.
- The Corn Hole/Twilight Bocce Club would like to have another game added in the Auditorium to alleviate wait time for the members. The club would be responsible for purchasing or building the new equipment, however, they will wait to see if the membership sustains. A possibility of reorganizing the play time may be considered, as well as increasing the registration fee.
- Two of the light globes over the pool tables in the Billiards Room were damaged. New light globes are being investigated to accommodate the current light fixtures. The room will not be closed during the restoration of the light fixtures.
- When trees need to be removed due to hazards, the homeowner must submit an ARC Landscaping Application to the Architectural Review Committee for approval.
- A handout from the ARC was distributed and reviewed pertaining to the Parameters for Approving Canopies/Gazebos in Leisure Glen. Decisions about the models and brands of the Canopies/Gazebos will be made upon the finalization and approval of all recommendations.
- There has been enthusiastic support from the new members of the Welcome Committee. Each member has been assigned 3 homes and took the gift bags to be distributed. The next meeting will be on 12/14/23.
- There was a request from a volunteer fire fighter about the annual election for a member of the Rocky Point Fire District Board, which will be held in December. Ex-Chief, Ken Staufer, Captain at BNL Fire Dept., is running for the seat and would like the opportunity to address the Leisure Glen community, introduce himself and answer questions. This might be of special interest to our community since recently, due to a staff shortage, a short-lived program was instituted to have Northwell Hospital respond to The Glen with ambulance service, and bill the residents for the transport. When the RPFDF responds to an emergency, there isn't any charge for the service. Fortunately, that program ended on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, and the RPFDF will be paying for that service if any resident did use Northwell Hospital and has been billed. When 911 is called, EMS is contacted and will send a local fire house (Rocky Point, Ridge, etc.). Each area will assist the other, when necessary, which is called mutual aid, and there is not a charge for that service.

# Health

Pelvic floor physical therapists have acquired additional training and expertise that makes us fully equipped to help both men and women with these conditions and improve quality of life. Treatment can include exercises, manual therapy, biofeedback, and education.

Here's an easy way to start.

Find and squeeze your pelvic floor muscles.

Try to hold the squeeze for 3 seconds.
