

Creative Corner

All About...John T. Mather

If you live in Leisure Glen, you know where Mather Hospital is! However, even though we all know its location, I wonder how many of us know the 'back story' of this nearby health facility?

Mather Hospital bears the name of businessman and philanthropist John Titus Mather. Mather was born in Port Jefferson on June 27, 1854, and died in Cuba on March 30, 1928. The descendant of a shipbuilding family, Mather spent most of his active life in that industry. His great grandfather was Captain John Wilsie, who built a sailing vessel in Port Jefferson as early as 1797. This was the beginning of the Mather ship building business. Under the direction of his father, John R. Mather, the business specialized in building large sailing vessels.

John T. Mather had other large businesses related to shipping. During World War I, he disposed of his holdings and retired from active business life. For many years prior to his death, Mather made careful study of how best to use the proceeds of his success to the benefit of those less fortunate. As early as 1916, he had made provisions in his will for setting aside a substantial sum to erect and maintain a non-sectarian charitable hospital – to give people the advantage of the best in hospital facilities at a reasonable cost. Built according to his wishes, John T. Mather Memorial Hospital opened its doors on December 29, 1929, and serves the community to this day.

If you are interested in learning more about John T. Mather and his family, you might consider a visit to The Mather House Museum. Located at 115 Prospect Street, it is a two-story, wood-frame structure with a gambrel roof and clapboard siding was built in 1795 by Captain Thomas Mather. The museum is also the home of the Port Jefferson Historical Society and offers visitors a unique opportunity to step back in time and experience life in the 18th century while learning about the Mather family and their contributions to the ship building industry in Port Jefferson.

THE MEASURE, by Nikki Erlick

One morning in the first part of March, before the equinox, every adult on the planet aged 22 or older wakes up to find a small mahogany-looking box outside their door. The box is six inches wide and three inches deep. It is indestructible. It is inscribed on the lid with your name and the legend, "The measure of your life lies within."

The next morning, anyone celebrating their 22nd birthday receives their personalized box, and so on.

So begins *The Measure*, by Nikki Erlick (2022, William Morrow), a novel set in pretty-much-where-we-are, tomorrow.

Who sent the boxes? How were they delivered? Receiving his at home after a red-eye flight, Ben recalls some sudden turbulence in the middle of the night. But the jolt was brief, and everyone's boxes arrive in their own time zone's morning.

What's in the boxes? Should they be opened? Once revealed, can whatever is in them ever be unseen?

The first people to open their boxes find a layer of tissue paper covering—a piece of string.

First rumors and then research report that the length of the string tells you how long a life you will be living. Soon, an online calculator is devised to translate the inches on your string into years.

Recipients come to be known by their relative string length. There are long-stringers and short-stringers.

Do you want to know which you are? Do your loved ones want to know? Your employers? Your government? Advertisers?

If you decide—or if you are allowed to decide whether or not to look at your string, how will it affect your plans? Your opportunities? Whether to run for political office, or who to vote for?

The situation is global, with authoritarian governments taking extreme measures, but the characters whose experiences we see are a group of New Yorkers.

Nina and Maura are two years into a wonderful and promising relationship. Are their strings of similar length?

Amie is Nina's sister, a teacher. How is she going to help her students process this situation?

Anthony is using the strings as a talking point in his campaign to be the next US president

Jack is Anthony's nephew, a new graduate of the military academy. Where will new string-based guidelines place his service?


Javier is Jack's academy roommate. His military career may be tied to Jack's.







December 2023 Board Meeting Highlights

December 8, 2023

- Received the 2-year pool permit from the Board of Health.
- Ongoing clean-up of leaves and gutters.
- Replaced drain on Orient Court and Glen Drive and piped it to the street drain.
- Advised on new Optimum Procedures for resales received from Hugh Morrison, Jr. at Optimum. Any documentation from the HOA pertaining to this information, that is provided to the sellers and the buyers, has been updated accordingly, to improve the transfer of the bulk services between these parties.
- No Hanukkah party due to a lack of volunteers.
- Accounts Supervisor and Board Treasurer are working on completing Year-End Payroll & Work Papers.

- After discussing the ARC's final parameters for canopies/gazebos and the committee's vote against allowing canopies/gazebos due to safety issues as well as other concerns, the Board voted in favor of <u>not</u> permitting the community to put up canopies on their property.
- The letter to the Governor about the Lithium-Ion Battery Facilities is now available on The Glen website, as well as hard copies by Debbie's office.

December 22, 2023

- Pole light on Cutchogue Court was hit and needed replacement.
- Replaced damaged mailbox on Glen Drive.
- Snow stakes were installed throughout the community.
- Four trees came down during recent storm, as well as many limbs.
- There was a problem with heat in the backstage area. A belt needed to be replaced on the heater fan.
- The fiber was installed in the Clubhouse and is working on all TVs except the one in the gym. The volume could not be increased therefore, a new TV was purchased.
- There were several complaints from various clubs about procuring insurance from caterers, servers and DJs. There was a discussion on the necessity for insurance, and it was proposed that if there were volunteers in each club to serve food, it would alleviate the need for insurance. This concept will be presented at the next Recreation Council meeting in January.
- Some of the gym equipment is in need of replacement. A recumbent bike (elliptical) can replace one of the current stationary bikes. The current Universal machine may be replaced for a newer model. A new rug or rubberized floor in the gym is under consideration.
- A concern about gas grills and the hazards they may impose were discussed. Some safety guidelines due to possible dangers may be created for their use and storage.

<u>Resale Report</u>: 7 sales, 9 listings (7 are vacant), and 4 homes are in contract and there is 1 scheduled closing.



Taste of the Best

EASY LEMON GARLIC PARMESAN CHICKEN

Serves 4 Total time 30 mins.

INGREDIENTS

2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken thighs
1/4 cup olive oil
1 large lemon juice (2 Tbs.)
4 cloves garlic, minced
1 tbsp. honey
1 tsp. paprika
1 tsp. onion powder
1/2 tsp. dried oregano
1/4 tsp. chili pepper, to taste
Salt and pepper, to taste



DIRECTIONS

1/4 cup parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 400° in oven or 375° in air fryer. Put chicken in ziplock bag Mix in small bowl: olive oil, lemon juice, honey, garlic, spices, salt, pepper and parmesan. Mix well, transfer 3/4 mixture to ziplock bag. Pour over chicken and coat chicken. Refrigerate 30min. or overnight, if desired. Discard marinade. Place chicken on a baking sheet and bake for 17-20 mins. or airfryer 12 mins. Serve with reserved marinade.
