Creative Corner

All About...The Ides of March

You've probably heard the soothsayer's warning to Julius Caesar in William Shakespeare's play of the same name: "Beware the Ides of March." Not only did Shakespeare's words stick, but they also branded the phrase—and the date, March 15—with a dark and gloomy connotation. It's likely that many people who use the phrase today don't know its true origin.

The Ides of March (/aɪdz/; Latin: Idus Martiae, Late Latin: Idus Martii) is the 74th day in the Roman calendar, corresponding to March 15. It was marked by several religious observances and was a deadline for settling debts in Rome. In 44 BC, it became notorious as the date of the assassination of Julius Caesar, which made the Ides of March a turning point in Roman history.

The Romans tracked time differently than we do today. They did not number each day of a month from the first to the last day. Instead, they counted back from three fixed points of the month: the Nones (the 5th or 7th, eight days before the Ides), the Ides (the 13th for most months, but the 15th in March, May, July and October) and the Kalends (1st of the following month). Originally the Ides were supposed to be determined by the full moon, reflecting the lunar origin of the Roman calendar. In the earliest calendar, the Ides of March would have been the first full moon of the new year.

Today, in our modern world, just about every pop culture reference to the Ides of March—save for those appearing in actual history-based books, movies or television specials—makes it seem like the day itself is cursed. For example, in 2011, Columbia Pictures released *The Ides of March*, a movie about an idealistic campaign staffer (Ryan Gosling) who gets a harsh lesson in dirty politics while working for an up-and-coming presidential candidate (George Clooney). The movie involves quite a bit of figurative backstabbing, but it's a pretty clear allegory for the death of Julius Caesar.

Did the assassination of Julius Caesar forever curse March 15th or was it just Shakespeare's mastery of language that forever darkened this day? If you look through history, you can certainly find enough horrible things that happened on March 15, but is it a case of life imitating art? Or art imitating life?

"Beware the Ides of March."

BOOK NOTES

THE FAREWELL TOUR, by Stephanie Clifford

When fictional country singer/songwriter/musician Lillian Waters, aka Water Lil, wrote her breakout song "Women's Work," this was her process:

She went with the feeling around a memory of being constrained as a little girl, while boys got to be out doing whatever they liked. Her mind went to school recess, where the girls were ladylike, playing jacks or jumping rope in a contained area, while the boys got to be boisterous. She thought of the nursery rhymes they chanted, like "Ring Around the Rosie" and "London Bridge." It seemed to her that that kind of chant would be a good place to start a song—but about housework rather than play.

She came up with *Wash it, dry it / Sweep it, dust it / Cook it, bake it / Start again.* She used her guitar to find an up -tempo melody.

Then she took a notepad and "wrote down every saying I could think of about women and men." When she came to "A woman's work is never done," she recognized it as her song's title.

"The rhythm had the right emphases to translate easy to a song," she says as first-person narrator of *The Farewell Tour* (2023, HarperCollins). "A *wo*-man's *work* is *ne*-ver *done*—and the consonants made it easy to sing fast without sounding slurred."

Back with her guitar, she tried different ways of singing that phrase to let "wash it, dry it" be sung at the same time as "a woman's work is never done" in the chorus.

Then she listed all the rhymes she could think of for "done": gun, fun, run. She liked "fun," and wrote a verse from the point of view of a new wife addressing her husband: When it's Friday and you're looking for some fun / You're off drinking and you're dancing with someone / While a woman's work is never done. So much, she intended the song to say, for thinking that the women's work we resent as girls might end with marriage.

Lil tinkered with the lyrics and the chords for three more days, then brought the song to her singing partner for some collaboration.

The Farewell Tour is a novel-length country song about the career of a woman who came from nothing, hit the highest height she could hit, pushed it further (and fell back some) and then was diagnosed with a performance-threatening throat ailment; hence her farewell tour.

Author Stephanie Clifford is an investigative journalist who has written for the *New York Times*, the *Atlantic*, the *New Yorker*, the *Economist* and *Bloomberg Businessweek*. She tells Lil's story in flashbacks between the Depression-era childhood Lil is determined to remember and the farewell tour she embarks on in1980.



The Members of the Leisure Glen Board do all of this and more!



January 2024 Board Meeting Highlights

January 19, 2024

- Due to the recent snowfall, 5 tons of salt and 30+ bags of ice melt have been used throughout the community. As the snow melts, it refreezes and the clean-up process continues.
- The automatic doors at the Clubhouse have had a problem with a button malfunction, and are being repaired.
- The purchase of an incumbent elliptical bike, which is being funded by The Gazette, is being ordered and should be delivered between 2/7-2/13.
- At a recent Recreation Council meeting, there was further discussion about liability insurance for servers and entertainers at different functions. The Social Club will attempt to recruit volunteers from the community to resolution.
- attempt to recruit volunteers from the community to resolve the expense of insurance coverage.

 The President of the Theater Club requested new chairs and better ventilation for the projection
- booth in the Auditorium. There will be further discussion on the necessity and costs of these upgrades.
- A concern about the condition of the stage floor after productions is being addressed. A new type
 of tape is being explored and should be used to preserve the look and finish of the floor. Overall
 care must be taken with all aspects of the stage such as the curtain and available sets.
- The two main Clubhouse bathrooms are being renovated. There was a review of all the updated components that will be utilized (floor tiles, wall tiles, sinks, faucets, toilets, etc.)
- The following future projects were reviewed:
 - o Updating the back bathrooms, painting the North Hall and the gyms are in discussion.
 - o Resurfacing the tennis courts will also be completed.
 - There will be some changes in the Administration Building in order to utilize current office space more efficiently.
 - o Pear Tree Court will be renovated in the Spring/Summer with the new pavers, lighting, and the removal of trees.

Future projects/improvements are always in consideration depending on how costly and extensive.

Resale Report: Resale report: 11 sales, 7 listings (5 are vacant), 1 home is in contract, and there are 2 scheduled closings.


looking after the wearer.



2 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp. salt 4 oz. softened butter

1 cup sugar 2 eggs

1-1/4 cup buttermilk or * soured milk

1 tbsp. caraway seeds



- In a large bowl, combine all ingredients and mix until well blended. Batter will be stiff
- Grease bread tins w/Crisco oil or Pam spray and place batter in tins. Slash top w/X
- Bake in a 350 degree oven for 1 hr. (test w/ toothpick and if it comes out clean and dry, remove from oven)
- Place breads on cookie racks and let cool
 - * To sour milk, use 1 to 1-1/2 tbsp. of lemon juice and let it sit for 10-15 min.

Helpful hint: If using a mixer, put some milk in the bottom first and then add the dry ingredients. This way, all mixture will be well blended.

Slice bread and serve with butter. Makes two loaves in 8" loaf pans. You can heat bread in micro if you prefer it warm. (I do.)
