

All About...August

"In August, the world slows down, and all you need is a good book and some sunshine." (Unknown)

August is one of the best months of the year to indulge in pleasures like being happy, relaxing, walking around in very light clothes or basking in the sunshine. It is summer's last hoorah before everyone heads back to school and pumpkin picking. Everything returns to the forefront of life, so make sure to relish all 31 days of August by enjoying some of the outdoor amenities that Leisure Glen has to offer.

And so just for the fun of it, here is some interesting trivia about August to share with your neighbors as you relax by the pool, or stroll on the Paseo, or gather for a friendly game of bocce, tennis or pickelball. August is the 8th month of the year in today's Gregorian calendar, but it was the sixth month (Sextilus) of the year in ancient Rome. August was named after Augustus Caesar (63 BCE–14AD). He was the first Roman emperor (though he never claimed the title) and grandnephew of the previous ruler, Julius Caesar (who named July after himself).

People born in August fall under the sun zodiac signs of Leo and Virgo. August has two birthstones: peridot and sardonyx, and two birth flowers: the vibrant multicolored gladiolus and the deep crimson poppy.

Some famous people born in August include Martha Stewart, Martin Sheen, Louis Armstrong, Neil Armstrong, Lucille Ball and former Presidents Benjamin Harrison, Herbert Hoover, Bill Clinton and Barack Obama.

The month of August is often referred to as the "dog days of summer" and, contrary to common belief, the dog days do not take their name from weather that "isn't fit for a dog," or heat that is so extreme it drives dogs mad. The dog days, in the most technical sense, refer to the one- to two-month interval in which a particularly bright star rises and sets with the sun, shining during the daylight hours and staying hidden at night. This star is known by three names: Sirius, the Dog Star and Alpha Canis Majoris.

BOOK NOTES

USE OF FORCE, by Brad Thor DINNER PARTY, by Sarah Gilmartin

Scot Harvath is a Navy SEAL and covert-ops counterterrorism expert for the CIA. Hero of over 20 thrillers, he gets to showcase all of his skills in #16, *Use of Force* (2017, Emily Bestler Books). Packed with intrigue, action and mayhem, this one suggests you don't need to have read #1-15 to get right into the story.

It starts on the Mediterranean Sea, where yet another group of North African refugees has been dispatched with insufficient fuel, food, water or safety equipment—i.e. life jackets—into dark and stormy conditions. They do have a satellite phone that's preprogrammed with the telephone number of the Italian Coast Guard. They're going to need it. A lot of people are in imminent danger of drowning. Among them is a chemist with ties to ISIS.

Why was that particular chemist trying to sneak

into Italy?

Scot Harvath isn't worried about that yet. He's at the Burning Man Festival three hours from Reno, Nevada. With more than 70,000 attendees, the weeklong summer solstice event in the desert is a wild and crazy adult camp in a temporary city, with designated neighborhoods for groups that include the ultra-rich and, somewhat oddly given the nature of the festivities, families with children.

Keeping control here is a challenge. This year, the CIA has information that suggests terrorists are in the mix. Harvath is on the trail of one of them now.

The fanciful costumes that so many are wearing make it easy to blend in with the crowd—especially when it turns out that Harvath's target is one of several people covered head-to-toe in identical outfits.

Stakes rise at Burning Man and in its aftermath. Dramatic events will transpire in Spain and France. Before the damage is done and/or averted, Harvath will be back to square one, realizing that's exactly where he, his team and their associates need to be.

In the Ireland-set *Dinner Party* (2021, Pushkin Press), the fireworks come from the heart, not AK-47s. It is Halloween 2018, the 16th anniversary of Kate's fraternal twin Elaine's death. Kate usually meets with her family elsewhere for the observance of this date, but this year she is preparing a gourmet meal in her flat for her brothers and sister-in-law. She will eat very little of it. The family members will fence and tease and support each other, with no major developments this evening.

Then we travel in time: 19 years ago, 12 years ago, six months ago, back to the date where we started, forward one year. The personalities and the family dynamic evolve in front of us, revealing how we got here

from there.



The dog days of summer are upon us. This month the Paseo Committee takes a muchneeded break because of the weather. If it's raining, or the heat and humidity are dangerously high, we do not meet on Thursday mornings. A big "THANK YOU" to Doris Herzberg, who faithfully and consistently waters and fertilizes all of the potted plants at the pool and Administration building, as well as inside and outside of the Clubhouse. To those of you who attended the Garden Club's 2nd Annual Brunch, we thank you for your support in making this a success.

For the very first time, the Garden Club planted several black and blue salvias around the Clubhouse and planters. They are considered hummingbird magnets, and several sightings have thrilled our residents. Hummingbirds are active on Long Island from April 15 – October 15. Other plants attractive to hummers include bee balm, cleomes, impatiens and petunias. For a more extensive list, you may want to check out

Since hummingbirds do not have a keen sense of smell, they rely on bright colors, and they are particularly fond of red. Red dye, however, should not be used to dye homemade nectar, as there are concerns regarding toxicity, which can harm the birds. Consider adding a red label or other item to attract them.

You can create your own hummingbird nectar by following this recipe:

Hummingbird Nectar Recipe

Bring 4 cups of water to a boil Add 1 cup of white granulated sugar Stir well until sugar is dissolved Boil sugar mixture for 2 minutes (prevents spoilage)

Allow mixture to thoroughly cool

Pour into clean hummingbird feeder and keep surplus mixture in refrigerator Place feeder in shade. Clean feeder weekly and replace nectar weekly to avoid harming these delightful creatures.

Re: All Pets including support animals

FYI, here is a summary of the rules and regulations:


- 1. All dogs must be on a leash and accompanied at all times.
- 2. Animals (dogs and cats) are not to be leashed to any fixed object, or let out to run loose in the yard.
- 3. The Leisure Glen Community only allows two (2) pets per household.
- 4. Animals are not permitted on any portion of the Paseo or on <u>any</u> of the lawn areas, including your own. Please keep your dog <u>on the common roadways</u>, away from the curbs, the lawn areas and the grassy area by the sump on Leisure Drive.
- 5. Please make sure <u>all waste is picked up and disposed of at your own home</u> in a sanitary manner. Never dispose of waste by throwing it into the storm drains, which can pose a health hazard for all concerned. The fine for not cleaning up after your pet is \$100.00. All reports of infractions will be investigated, and the fines will be enforced.
- 6. To the extent permitted by law, any owner shall be absolutely liable to each and all remaining owners, their guests, employees, etc. for any unreasonable noise or damage to person or property caused by any animals brought or kept on the properties.
- 7. Residents requiring service and support animals must provide the Administration office with the appropriate documentation/authorization. Please be aware that <u>service and support animals</u> are permitted in <u>all areas</u> of the residence and common areas.
- 8. Animals (dogs & cats) belonging to homeowners, occupants or their tenants, <u>must be registered</u> with the Administration Office. As per House Rule #10, in Section X of the Leisure Glen Homeowners' Manual, certain breeds have been restricted by our insurance carrier.

Fall prevention: Simple tips to prevent falls

Falls put you at risk of serious injury. Prevent falls with these simple fall-prevention measures, from reviewing your medications to hazard-proofing your home.

Fall prevention may not seem like a lively topic, but it's important. As you get older, physical changes and health conditions and sometimes the medications used to treat those conditions make falls more likely. In fact, falls are a leading cause of injury among older adults. Still, fear of falling doesn't need to rule your life. Instead, consider six simple fall-prevention strategies.

1. Make an appointment with your doctor

Begin your fall-prevention plan by making an appointment with your doctor. Be prepared to answer questions such as:

- What medications are you taking? Make a list of your prescription and over-the-counter medications and supplements or bring them with you to the appointment. Your doctor can review your medications for side effects and interactions that may increase your risk of falling.
- Have you fallen before? Write down the details, including when, where and how you fell. Be prepared to
 discuss instances when you almost fell but were caught by someone or managed to grab hold of something just
 in time. Details such as these may help your doctor identify specific fall-prevention strategies.
- Could your health conditions cause a fall? Certain eye and ear disorders may increase your risk of falls. Be prepared to discuss your health conditions and how comfortable you are when you walk

2. Keep moving

Physical activity can go a long way toward fall prevention. With your doctor's OK, consider activities such as walking. If you avoid physical activity because you're afraid it will make a fall more likely, tell your doctor. He or she may recommend carefully monitored exercise programs or refer you to a physical therapist. The physical therapist can create a custom exercise program aimed at improving your balance, flexibility, muscle strength and gait.

3. Wear sensible shoes

Consider changing your footwear as part of your fall-prevention plan. High heels, floppy slippers and shoes with slick soles can make you slip, stumble and fall.

4. Remove home hazards

Take a look around your home. Your living room, kitchen, bedroom, bathroom, hallways and stairways may be filled with hazards. To make your home safer:

5. Light up your living space

Keep your home brightly lit to avoid tripping on objects that are hard to see.

6. Use assistive devices

Your doctor might recommend using a cane or walker to keep you steady. Other assistive devices can help, too. For example:

- Hand rails for both sides of stairways
- Nonslip treads for bare-wood steps
- A raised toilet seat or one with armrests
- Grab bars for the shower or tub
