# **Presidents** Page



Recently, the Board of Directors reviewed the process for conducting the election of Board directors. We did this since our by-laws do not address the specifics of this process.

We have updated the Election Committee Charter to reflect all of the steps, and we have added an outline of important dates and events that will ensure a smooth procedure. We gave particular attention to solving the secret-ballot issue. We looked at methods used

by other communities and organizations and decided to adopt a three-envelope system,

which is outlined in House Rule #17. Making it a house rule, which you should be receiving shortly, rather than an amendment to the by-laws, gives the Board greater flexibility to tweak the details in the future if the need arises.

All of these changes will make it reasonable to return to handling ballots in-house at the next election.

On another front, we want to urge you NOT to call Optimum for individual fiber installation. Some who have done this have had success and some have had disasters. The randomness of this approach threatens our ability to hold Optimum to their promises and have everything completed safely and correctly.

We are working now on putting our Survey committee in place. Thank you to all who showed interest in joining.



### **Creative** Corner

#### All About...The World Series by Mary J. Collins

"You don't just accidentally show up in the World Series." (Derek Jeter)

Each year, the primary focus in any professional sport is the race for a championship. Every sport has their pinnacle trophy, but none is as coveted as baseball's World Series, a best of seven contest that celebrates our national pastime.

Baseball has a rich and storied history dating back to the mid-19th century. The game evolved from various stick-and-ball games played in Europe and North America, eventually becoming the national pastime of the United States. The first professional baseball league, the National Association, formed in 1871, followed by the more successful National League in 1876. The American League was established in 1901, and the two leagues merged in 1903 to form Major League Baseball. The first official World Series was played in 1905.

The World Series was first broadcast on television in 1947 (though it was only televised to a few surrounding areas). In 1951, it was televised coast to coast. 1955 marked the first time that the World Series was televised in color.

The World Series is traditionally held in October between the champion teams of the <u>American League</u> (AL) and the <u>National</u> <u>League</u> (NL). The winner of the World Series championship is determined through a <u>best-of-seven</u> <u>playoff</u>. Prior to the AL and NL being split into divisions in 1969, the team with the best regularseason win–loss record in each league automatically clinched its league's <u>pennant</u> and advanced to the World Series. Since then, each league has conducted a <u>League Championship Series</u> preceding the World Series to determine which teams will advance, while those series have been preceded in turn by <u>Division Series</u> since 1995, and <u>Wild Card</u> <u>games or series</u> in each league since 2012.

The 2024 World Series is scheduled to begin on October 25 and continue through a potential Game 7 on November 2. The scheduled off-days are October 27 and October 31. However, if the NL Championship Series and AL Championship Series both end by October 19, the World Series will begin on Tuesday, October 22, with a potential Game 7 coming on Wednesday, October 30.

#### BOOK NOTES by Dorothy Scheuer

#### TAKE MY WORD FOR IT by Anatoly Liberman

A large number of the entries in *Take My Word for It: A Dictionary of English Idioms* (2022, University of Minnesota Press) are Britishisms we may never have heard, and some of the familiar ones sadly have no discoverable sources. But they are all listed in easy-to-find alphabetical order, and there are some interesting origin stories here, including:

B62. Bronx cheer: "A sound of derision made by the mouth, also known as a *raspberry*." Popularized at the Fairmount Athletic Club and Yankee Stadium, both in the Bronx, it's also documented in 13<sup>th</sup> century southern Italy.

C36. Cock of the walk: "The person who dominates others." The training area for cockfights used to be known as the walk. Cock of the walk was the accolade given to the largest and most successful fighter.

C58. Crack a bottle: "Open a bottle so as to drink its contents." Soldiers are credited with being able to neatly crack off a bottle's head, no corkscrew required.

C82. Cut of one's jib: "One's appearance." Specifically refers to the first impression someone makes. The jib is the foremost sail on a ship, and the ship's origin could quickly be recognized by its jib's design—particularly helpful in wartime.

D45. Drink like a fish: This one just sounds good; it appears that fish rarely actually drink.

F1. Face the music: "An incentive or spur of activity." Orienting mantra for actors about to go onstage and/or for soldiers about to be drummed out of service.

H46. Hit the hay: "To go to bed." Straw was the traditional bedding material for tramps and for seamen on old sailing-ships.

N33. Not worth a rap: "Worthless." A *rap* was a counterfeit coin.

S76. Steal one's thunder: "Achieve success by preempting someone else's attempt to impress." The manager of the Drury Lane Theater declined to produce a play by English critic John Dennis (1657-1734) but co-opted the artificial thunder effect Dennis invented for that play, using it in Drury Lane's production of *Macbeth*. Dennis protest-ed, "They won't act my tragedy, but they steal my thunder."

T7. Take the cake: "To carry off the honors." In games in rural England, cake was often the prize.

W16. When my ship comes home/comes in: "One day when I am in luck." From the legal agreement to pay costs once shipped goods are safely received.

W34. Wrong end of the stick: If that's what you've got hold of, you've made a mistake; you've grabbed the soiled end that dragged through whatever that was (*ew*) on the ground.

# GARDEN CORNER

Time to get to our fall garden chores. The paseo committee is busy clearing the beds and planters of summer annuals. Come join us Thursdays at 9:30 am (weather permitting) at Pear Tree Court. If you haven't done so already, help the Garden Club with a \$20 donation.

Some potted plants may need to be re-potted, especially the tropical ones in outdoor containers. Add new potting mix and increase the pot by one size to keep them happy all winter. Make sure to check for any critters or pests before bringing anything inside, and consider applying an insecticidal soap to the soil after re-potting so it leaches down into the new pot.

According to the Old Farmer's Almanac, the first Fall frost for our area is October 30<sup>th</sup>. It is an estimate based on historical climate data, not set in stone. Keep an eye on the nighttime temperatures. Frost is predicted when air temperatures near 32 degrees F.

Dividing perennials is a great way to make your beds fuller and, if you have too many of one thing, seek out another neighborhood gardener and swap – another great way to extend those beds and make new garden buddies.

October is good for pruning most deciduous trees (trees whose leaves fall off). After the leaves have dropped, pruning is easier, because you can see the "skeleton" of the tree, and they are in a dormancy period. Wait on the Crape Myrtles until March, and roses until late February. Evergreens can be pruned now, and most folks feed them lightly after pruning, as well as in late winter (around March).

Garden tool maintenance is a must. Sanding, sharpening and oiling will preserve your tools for many seasons. For \$5 per tool, Brinkman's on Route 25A in Miller Place will take care of them and they'll look like new.

It's also a good time to check on your winter home maintenance. Test the heating system, prune tree limbs from doors and windows, drain garden hose, and cover A\C unit.


Last month we wrote about mums for fall seasonal color. Another group of cold-tolerant plants without flowers can help brighten the fall garden when almost everything else is looking tired and ready for winter. Ornamental cabbage and kale are the same species as their edible kin, but have much fancier and more colorful foliage than their cousins from the vegetable garden. These plants are sometimes offered as "flowering" cabbage and kale, and are grown for their large rosettes of colorful leaves, not the flowers. These plants are very showy and come in a variety of colors ranging from white to pinks, purples and reds. Those types with deeply-cut, curly, frilly or ruffled leaves are called ornamental kale, while the ones with broad, flat leaves often edged in a contrasting color are called ornamental cabbage. Until it gets cool, the plants won't have much color. The white, pink or red pigments really begin to show with frost and cold weather getting great vivid colors below 50 degrees F. They are really cool-weather plants, and once acclimated, they can survive temperatures as low as 5 degrees F. Of course, if they are covered under a few inches of snow for a week or two, they are finished. Plant in a sunny location in a moderately moist rich soil. Bury the stem until the lowest leaves are flush with the soil surface. Keep the plants well-watered. Try to position them where you will see the colorful center. This author planted the ornamental cabbage and kale last year in a garden bed with southern exposure and because of the relatively mild winter, those plants lasted until spring.

#### Jack Tevere 1928-2024

How ya doin' kid? His raspy voice always brought a smile to my face. And to be honest, I liked that he called me a kid. After all, what 70-yearold doesn't want to be called a kid.

Jack Tevere was a member of the Men's Club Committee when I joined the club. The committee designation is a holdover from years past, when only a small number of committee members (original Italian American Club) managed the organization.



Jack didn't warm up to people initially, but once he did, you had a solid friend. Someone you could count on. My first year in the Men's Club was my first year living in the Glen. Think about your first day at a new school. Lots of adventures ahead and plenty of new friendships to look forward to. To say it was overwhelming is an understatement. So, I was very fortunate that Jack warmed up to me and showed me the ropes.

I think what initially connected us was a bar he had owned with his brother in Whitestone, on Francis Lewis Boulevard. He worked for NYC and ran the bar at night. I grew up in a small community wedged between Flushing and Bayside called Auburndale. Whitestone is a neighboring community. And my high school buddies and I frequented Jack's bar. He once actually called the cops on us to have us removed from the premises as we were getting a little rowdy. We didn't know each other back then, but the connection brought us closer many years later.

We would get together every so often to discuss the Men's Club business, and our conversations often ran long. We discovered that we liked going to kosher delis and having hot dogs and knishes for lunch. I tried on several occasions to take him to Ben's kosher deli over by the Smith Haven mall, but his arthritis always seemed to get in the way.

Jack and Helen loved cruising. If I recall correctly, they went on over 90 sailings. Mostly with family members, often traveling with grand- and great-grandchildren. Jack also shared with me a picture of a Leisure Glen cruise they took, pointing out many Leisure Glen friends and neighbors. Yes, he did share some stories from the cruise and swore me to secrecy. So, your story is safe with me, Ann.


One evening Kathy and I were having dinner at a local restaurant, and the server mentioned that a large group was coming in shortly to celebrate someone's birthday. I had my back to the entrance and couldn't see the attendees arriving. But I couldn't mistake the voice. I turned around and there was Jack with his family, preparing to celebrate his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

You could feel the love and admiration his family had for Jack. They were happy to spend their time with a man who inspired them, celebrating a significant milestone. He truly was a very blessed man. All in all, Jack lived the life all of us hope for.





# **TICKET SELLING FOR EVENTS**



- Clubs are required to have Officers and Committee Members in order reserve a maximum of (4) tables <u>only</u> before the ticket sale date for in house functions.
- The first **two** days of ticket sales are open to **residents only.** After the second day for our in house events you can puchase tickets for outside family and friends. For outside events not requiring transportation the **two** day rule for ticket sales will be waived as long as the venue can accommodate the total ticket sales. If you are a single resident, you can purchase an additional ticket for a guest on the day of the ticket sales. Only one table of (8) at a time may be taken by a resident buying the tickets.
- Residents can purchase tickets by check. Cash will only be accepted at the discretion of the Club. Clubs must specify on their flyers if they are accepting cash.
- Outside media advertisement and ticket sales for our Club Events is strictly prohibited to the general public.

On the day of tickets sales at the Clubhouse, Residents only (not the Club) have had a longtime tradition where the first Resident at the Clubhouse starts a numbered signup sheet. That person would be number one on the sheet, and then the next Resident signing up would be number two, etc., etc. Once you have put your name on the signup sheet, you must remain in the Clubhouse. Only one Resident can sign up for one table of eight.

At the time the Club/Organization opens the window to actually sell the tickets they will verbally call out the names from the signup sheet. The Clubhouse Auditorium capacity for dining is 176 with tables off the dance floor and 208 with tables on the dance floor. A maximum of 8 at a table is allowed. You will see on the floor plan that the Clubs will reserve 2 to 4 tables prior to the ticket sales for their Officers and Committee people who run that event.


